Once again I am pleased to report a successful year for Hinckley and District Museum, but that success does not indicate complacency amongst members of the Museum Board

Our temporary exhibitions have again attracted a large number of visitors with a total of 1942 coming to the Museum in the past year. Two exhibitions were organised by Andy Pratt on the subjects of Hinckley Carnival and Hinckley & Burbage Cage Bird Society. There was a display covering 700 Years of Hinckley Market and an exhibition of pre-Roman artefacts provided by Hinckley Archaeological Society. Andy Pratt also produced an illustrated history of 'Hinckley Carnival' which has enjoyed considerable sales with profits going to the Museum's building appeal fund.

This year has once again seen a programme of talks and special events. Talks now take place at Café Impressions in the Atkins Building, which has been made available free of charge with the opportunity for refreshments. We are most grateful to Paul Bennett who runs the café. Topics covered in the talks have ranged from Hinckley Market to Hinckley Carnival. Another Film Night was held in the Council Chamber organised by Stewart Watson and Lindsay Orton and attended by the Mayor and Mayoress. Our thanks are due to Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council for this opportunity to raise more funds to pay off the Council loan covering work on the gable end of the Museum.

A summer Quiz in July was ably organised by Jean Jones and once again attracted a capacity attendance at the Museum. Wash Days, which Jill Webster has made a popular event every August, ably assisted by her band of washerwomen, again brought a host of children with their parents and grandparents on Museum Mondays. Heritage Open Days were amongst the most successful we have enjoyed in recent years with a total of 154 visitors. We continue to be awarded accreditation as a 'Quality Assured Visitor Attraction' by VisitEngland.

This year has seen involvement with Redmoor High School once again with students using the resources of the Museum as an aid to their *Footprints to the Future* project. An exhibition, opened by BBC history presenter Dr Nina Ramirez, was mounted in the Atkins Building displaying the outcome of their research. We have had school visits from Nuneaton and Bedworth and also classes from St Peter's and Holliers Walk schools. The role of the Museum in educating school groups across two counties is now well established.

Numerous group visits have taken place ranging from groups catering for the very young to those for persons of more mature years. We have enjoyed nocturnal visits from the 'Absolutely Haunted Team' from Leicester and the ghosts also enjoyed the experience!

It is with great sadness that I record the death of Bill Partridge in September of this year at the age of 92 Bill was Vice-Chairman when the Museum Group was first founded in 1991 and played a most active part in the development of the Museum until his health prevented regular involvement in our activities. Bill and his wife, Grace, funded the restoration of the 1740s stocking frame at the Museum which Bill had first restored in the 1930s.

Fund raising to pay off the Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council loan for work on the gable end has continued in the past year and the sum raised has now reached around £15,000. We are most grateful to all those individuals and organisations who have contributed towards this sum Renewal of the thatch has become necessary and the Board have decided that we can no longer afford the maintenance of the building and the funding of the Museum. Discussions are under way with the Council on this issue. We have also been informed after a survey of the building that the storage facilities with their ever increasing contents are placing too great a load on the building and alternative storage arrangements must be sought. Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council

have now agreed to pay for the insurance of the building and we hope the other issues already described will be satisfactorily resolved

This year Susan Turner, who has been our curatorial adviser for very many years, finally took her well earned retirement. We are pleased to record our thanks to her for the splendid support and expertise she has provided and to welcome her friend and colleague, Fiona Ure, as her successor

Publicity for all our activities in the past year has been provided by the *Hinckley Times, Nuneaton News, Leicester Mercury*, Radio Leicester and Oak FM. Our thanks are due to them for their continued support. A new Museum leaflet has been produced this year, professionally produced and part funded from a competition award from the Hinckley and Bosworth Tourism Partnership Work on a new Museum website is also underway with help from the Hinckley Campus of North Warwickshire and Hinckley College, almost opposite the Museum, which opened in September

The vital contribution of our volunteers in the past year has kept the Museum open on every scheduled occasion and also when group visits have taken place at other times. I should like to record the enormous debt of thanks from all our visitors and from the directors to these volunteers who have given so much time and effort to the Museum. Roger Morley and Jean Gilbert have maintained the beautiful cottage garden to the delight of numerous visitors and also wedding parties who have come to the Museum for photographs from the Register Office opposite. Jean Jones has continued to ensure that the tearoom is effectively supplied and that cataloguing is organised on a regular and most efficient basis.

Another successful year owes much to the work of the Board of Directors Phillip Lindley, our Secretary and Treasurer, has worked assiduously to ensure the smooth and efficient operation of the Museum in a cost effective manner. Neville Jackson, as Minutes Secretary, has ensured the accurate recording of Board Meetings and the careful marking of all new acquisitions that have been catalogued. He and his wife Pat have been present at the Museum to assist with numerous party visits. Greg Drozdz has again conducted numerous walks and raised large sums of money for the Museum. Andy Pratt, besides organising two exhibitions and producing the Carnival history, has been involved in many Museum duties. Both he and Greg have given much effort to the Museum despite health problems in the past year.

Jill Beavin, besides acting as P A for the Chairman, has carried out numerous duties at the entrance desk. We are particularly grateful for work carried out be Ann Crabtree and Pat Jotham who during the past year have agreed to serve as co-opted members of the Board alongside their other duties as volunteers. I am sure that all Friends of Hinckley and District Museum will join with me in expressing deep thanks to these Board members for all their work in the past year.

I concluded my report last year by saying that it was time for a new Chairman to take over. Should I be again elected I must state categorically that this will be the last year when I will serve as Chairman and member of the Board. Jill will also be stepping down as we will be moving to Ashby de la Zouch in 2013. Finally, my thanks to all Friends for their faithful support and interest in the year that is past and for the year that is to come.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The Company was incorporated on 24th July 1992 and is a registered charity. The Company is principally engaged to advance the education of the public in Hinckley and district and to benefit the public by the provision of a museum.
