### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

### Objectives and aims

- 1 To further or benefit the residents of Bolton and the neighbourhood, without distinction of sex, sexual orientation, race or of political, religious or other opinions by associating together the said residents and the local authorities, voluntary and other organisations in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation leisure time occupation with the objective of improving the conditions of life for the residents.
- 2 the relief of financial hardship by the recycling and provision of furniture, clothes and other household items and the provision of community toolboxes for use on community projects.
- 3 to provide affordable community transport facilities in Bolton for people who have special need of such facilities because they are elderly, poor or disabled, people with young children or those living in isolated areas where no adequate public transport facilities exist.

In furtherance of these objects but not otherwise, the trustees shall have power:

to establish or secure the establishment of a community centre and to maintain or manage or co-operate with any statutory authority in the maintenance and management of such a centre for activities promoted by the charity in furtherance of the above objects.

### RESERVES

The trustees wish to maintain the general fund at a level to cover day to day running expenses. However it is difficult to obtain funds and the money available is spent on the charity's activities.

### **ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE**

### Charitable activities

We are a small charity with limited funding, we have no paid staff. We rely on our unpaid volunteers to help the charity deliver its services. We have people who come from different areas of Bolton Metropolitan Borough.

Volunteers who turn up offering to help.

The probation service place people with our charity (on Community Service)

Other people come along to gain work experience. All our unpaid volunteers have freely given time and effort to help other people turn round their lives. It's been a real team effort. We can see the difference we are making to peoples lives.

### Achievements to date:

We have set up a food bank to distribute food to people and families in need. We also setup a soup kitchen feeding people in need.

We recycle furniture and household goods to people in need. We have also provided clothing and household goods.

We operate on a very small bank balance. We have given a large amount of recycled goods away to families in poverty. We have helped families in food poverty. We trained up community volunteers to support other charities / voluntary groups.

None of our unpaid volunteers have been paid in monetary terms but have slept well knowing that they have helped other people / families turn round their lives.

### ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard 102 as applied to small entities by section 1A of the standard, the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

### **Public Benefit**

In the opinion of the Trustees the charity is a Public Benefit Entity.

#### **Income**

All income is included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

### Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

### **Tangible Fixed Assets**

Tangible fixed assets are measured at their original cost value, or subsequent revaluation, or if donated, as described above. Cost value includes all costs expended in bringing the asset into its intended working condition.

Depreciation has been provided at the following rates in order to write off the assets to their anticipated residual value over their estimated useful lives.

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

### **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
