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TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2013

The Trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2013

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's Memorandum and Articles of Association, the Companies Act 2006 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005

Structure, governance and management

The charity is a company limited by guarantee (number 04190566) and was incorporated on 30 March 2001 It was registered with the Charity Commissioners on 12 February 2002 (number 1090543)

The Articles of Association of Keighley Healthy Living Network paras 25-49 details the requirements and duties of the trustees, their numbers, powers, appointment and retirement, eligibility, disqualification and removal, payment of expenses, appointment of officers, proceedings, quorum, calling for meetings, procedures of meetings, management of bank accounts, passing of resolutions, appointments of subcommittees, rights to expend funds and to enter into contracts

The trustees, who are also the directors for the purpose of company law, and who served during the year were

None of the trustees has any beneficial interest in the company. All of the trustees are members of the company and guarantee to contribute £1 in the event of a winding up

Organisational decision making

The Manager reports on the work of the organisation to the Board of Trustees bi-monthly. The Manager also reports on the state of the finances of Keighley Healthy Living Network. Any trustee can ask for further information from staff members.

Day to day management of funds, staff buildings, work programmes and development of new initiatives is delegated to the Manager/s

Staff and volunteers

Keighley Healthy Living Network currently employ 10 part time staff that work both within the centre and in out-reach settings. We have excellent staff retention rates and who are highly committed to the charity. Keighley Healthy Living Network is supported by a range of volunteers who support our projects such as Wellbeing Cafe, luncheon clubs, reception, Breastfeeding Drop-Ins and older peoples groups. In addition we contract freelance staff to deliver a number of our specialised projects such as exercise for older people and people with learning difficulties.

Membership of wider network

Keighley Healthy Living Network is a member of Keighley Health and Wellbeing Partnership Board, Airedale, Wharfedale & Craven Clinical Commissioning Group Healthy & Wellbeing Hub, the National Council for Voluntary Organisations and Keighley & Ilkley Voluntary Community Association (KIVCA) These memberships have no impact on the day to day operations of Keighley Healthy Living Network

TRUSTEE'S REPORT (CONTINUED) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2013

Relationships with other organisations

Keighley Healthy Living Network has no subsidiaries Keighley Healthy Living Network works in partnership with a range of other voluntary, community and statutory agencies in order to deliver its key work programmes

Major risks to Keighley Healthy Living Network

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks. The major risks to which Keighley Healthy Living Network is exposed is the non-renewal of existing commissions beyond March 2014.

Insurance and other risks

Keighley Healthy Living Network carries public liability, employer's liability and contents insurance through CaSE Insurance. The buildings insurance is provided by Ansvar through the Cellar Project who own the property that Keighley Healthy Living Network occupies.

Activities and Objectives

Keighley Healthy Living Network is a charity based in central Keighley, which aims to support the health and wellbeing of the local population

We offer a wide range of activities with a focus on

- Breastfeeding Support
- Young parents
- Older people
- Nutrition and physical activity

To support our key areas of work we offer a wide range of activities based in our centre and various outreach settings and include -

Breastfeeding support – breastfeeding drop-ins, training of mums to become breastfeeding buddles (peer supporters), telephone helpline, home visits and a social media group

Young parents – Preparation for Parenting (a 12 week antenatal course designed for young parents), T-Natal (a postnatal group offering support and encouraging attachment for parent and child), one to one support and a social media group

Older people – a variety of weekly art and craft and groups, an exercise group, function clubs and a monthly wellbeing cafe with a focus on people with mild dementia/mental health problems

Nutrition and physical activity – healthy weight programmes, healthy lifestyle courses, nutrition talks, cooking course, cycling, swimming and walking

We also offer volunteering opportunities and student placements. We have strong partnerships and links across Keighley and Bradford District. Keighley Healthy Living Network works with local people across all age, ethnicity and ability ranges, we frequently consult with local people to identify what will be the most effective way that we can work with them to improve their own health through lifestyle changes. We aim to tackle social isolation, inequalities in health and build confidence and capacity of the local population.

TRUSTEE'S REPORT (CONTINUED) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2013

Achievements and performances

All the trustees feel that Keighley Healthy Living Network has had a very successful year and developments have included designing a new website and publicity materials to raise our profile and increase users to the service. We have built on our activities programme and introduced a number of new projects including Jamie's Ministry of Food Cooking Programmes and craft and gardening courses.

We have had a change in management and structure to now provide both project and business support to the charity. Working with PERS we have reviewed our policies and procedures and updated staff and consultancy contracts.

During this period we have reached over 1,500 people (April 12 to March 13) and on average support 300 people per week attending activities/groups. We have evaluated all our groups and had some excellent feedback from users of the service on how it has helped their wellbeing and confidence

Public benefit statement

In setting our objectives and planning our activities all trustees have given serious consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and in particular the advancement of health, wellbeing and citizenship

Organisational concern

As stated earlier, the major risk to which Keighley Healthy Living Network is exposed is the non-renewal of existing commissions beyond March 2014. Keighley Healthy Living Network is actively seeking to secure alternative future funding. As the charity has considerable financial resources, the trustees/directors believe that the charity is well placed to manage its financial risks successfully despite the current uncertain economic outlook. The trustees/directors have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements.

Fundraising

Keighley Healthy Living Network raises fund through grant applications to charitable trusts and securing commissions for work from statutory agencies including the local authority and the health service. Our main funder are Leeds, Bradford & Airedale PCT and Bradford Metropolitan District Council. Other funders are shown in the annual accounts.

Financial review

The Statement of Financial Activities shows net outgoing resources for the year of £38,156 (2012 net outgoing resources of £36,099)

Reserves policy

Keighley Healthy Living Network has a policy of holding adequate reserves to pay staff for up to three months in the case of redundancy. In addition the trustees have allocated 16% of forecast annual expenditure to a contingency fund. With forecast expenditure for 2013/14 estimated to be £187,000, KHL has set the fund ("Sustainability and Development fund") of £31,000 to allow for ebbs and flows in income and expenditure. All unrestricted funds, including designated funds, come within the definition of free reserves. The trustees consider that the unrestricted reserves are at an acceptable level.

TRUSTEE'S REPORT (CONTINUED) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2013

Asset cover for funds

Note 14 sets out an analysis of the assets attributable to the various funds and a description of the trusts. These assets are sufficient to meet the charity's obligations on a fund by fund basis.

Plans for the future

Keighley Healthy Living Network intends to build on its progress and its established programmes. To also continue to build on our partnerships to ensure adequate funding is secured for the future.

We are expanding our role within older people and isolation projects, sexual health, obesity and mental well-being. We aim to increase the number of staff and support more volunteers and student placements. Also we are reviewing our evaluation and monitoring methods to ensure effectiveness of the projects can be measured.

1 Accounting policies

1 1 Basis of preparation

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 2006

12 Incoming resources

Core funding grants are credited to the income and expenditure account as and when receivable

Revenue grants for specific purposes are credited to the income and expenditure account as and when received and unspent amounts are carried forward as part of the restricted funds in the balance sheet Income may be deferred if it is received in advance of the period to which it relates

Donations and other income are credited to the income and expenditure account as and when receivable

13 Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be recovered and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for beneficiaries

Governance costs includes those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories on the SOFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

It is the policy of the charity to only capitalise individual items costing in excess of £500. Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows.

The organisation acts as custodians of funds belonging to a local project based in Keighley called Choices. The total funds held as at 31 March 2013 were £3,582 (2012 - £3,152) and is included within other creditors. The object of this organisation is to rehabilitate people whose lives have been spoilt by drug or alcohol dependency. The aims of the Choices Project are consistent with those of Keighley Healthy Living in that the group work to ensure better long term health for people from Keighley who aim to be drug free as a result of working with the project and therefore will live healthier, longer and happier lives as a result. The project funds can only be utilised upon receiving authorisation from Cherry Connolly (Chairman of Choices) together with authorised Keighley Healthy Living payee. Safe custody is assured through the safeguards that are applicable to all the Keighley Healthy Living Network bank accounts. The organisation is holding these funds until such times as the project obtains charitable status.
