Structure, Governance and Management

Governing document

Knowle West Health Association is a charitable company limited by guarantee incorporated on February 20, 2001 and registered as a charity on June 17, 2004. It is governed by its memorandum and articles

Directors and trustees

The directors of the charitable company are its trustees for the purpose of charity law and throughout this report are collectively referred to as the trustees. Trustees are recruited from the local community and appointed by members at the Annual General Meeting as set out in the Articles of Association. No outside party is able to appoint trustees. The trustees who served during the year are listed on page 2.

Risk management

The Trustees review the major risks to which the charity is exposed on a regular basis. Where appropriate, systems or procedures have been established to mitigate the risks the charity faces. Procedures are in place to ensure compliance with health and safety of staff, volunteers, clients and visitors to the association

Objectives and activities for the public benefit

The purposes of the charity as set out in the objects contained in the company's memorandum of association, as amended on November 18, 2008, are the protection, preservation and promotion of good health in particular but not exclusively for the residents of Knowle West

The focus of our activities

Knowle West Health Association is one of the longest running community organisations in Knowle West and is based at Filwood Community Centre. Our aim is to make Knowle West in particular, but not exclusively, a healthier area in which to live and we want Knowle West Health Association to be a place where people can come with their ideas about how this could happen. KWHA is run by local people for local people. It is keen that local peoples' voices should be heard. It encourages local people to be involved in their community and also aims to empower them by giving help and advice. We work in partnership with other agencies both locally and across the city.

How our activities deliver public benefit

Our main activities and who we try to help are described below. We have had regard to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and we consider that our activities provide benefit to our local community.

Achievements and performance

The charity continues to fulfil its objectives of promoting good health through the work of

The Community Kitchen Project

The Community Kitchen offers a wide range of healthy cookery courses. Work has been done on a one to one basis as well as with community groups. The Kitchen Co-Coordinator has also worked with schools looking at Healthy Lunch Boxes for children.

It's a Man Thing!

It's a Man Thing' is a local men's group keen to promote good health in the Knowle West area. They are trained to undertake blood pressure testing and have produced posters and leaflets which are available on request and displayed in gent's toilets in local clubs.

The Friendship Club

The Friendship Club provides a weekly opportunity for local residents over the age of 40 to get together to play bingo and have a chat with others over a nice cup of tea! In addition to the weekly bingo, the group goes on a few trips throughout the year, has an Easter Bonnet parade and a Christmas lunch

The group is led by a dedicated Users Group of which the members are all volunteers giving their time freely to ensure the group runs smoothly

Advocacy Service

The Advocacy project offers help to individuals who need support with issues related to their health or social care. The issues which clients request help range from assistance with filling out forms, housing issues, signposting to appropriate services etc.

Footcare sessions

With funding received, Knowle West Health Association teamed up with a private Foot Health Practitioner to offer good quality, local affordable footcare sessions to older people in Knowle West. Having access to regular footcare can greatly enhance people's physical and mental health and wellbeing as early detection of problems can reduce the risk of infections, enable greater mobility, contribute to increased self esteem, and an overall sense of wellbeing. It can also help to reduce falls and therefore to help maintain older people's independence. Examples of treatment offered include basic footcare needs such as toe nail cutting, to more specialist treatment such as corn, wart, verruca care and ingrown toenails to name but a few. The Foot Health Practitioner also advised on the correct footwear and worked with people with Diabetes.

Let's Grow Community Allotment

Let's Grow Community Allotment is a new community scheme started in Spring 2012

Its twofold aim is to produce high quality local fruit and vegetables for the Community Kitchen and local vegetables box scheme and help local people learn to grow and cook their own food in a welcoming and supportive environment

Financial review

The policy of the trustees is to work towards maintaining unrestricted funds at a level required to meet three months resources expended. Specific projects and activities are not undertaken unless and until funding has been secured

Net expenditure for the year was £5,876 leaving total funds carried forward of £90,330

Plans for future periods

KWHA hopes to continue the expansion of its work with all members of the community, especially with the Allotment – Lets Grow Project during the forthcoming year However, future activities depend on securing the necessary funding and the staff continues to work hard in this respect

Knowle West Health Association would cease to function without its dedicated team of Directors, the hard work of its Staff and the support of our Funders to whom we are very grateful

1 Accounting policies

Accounting convention

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards. In preparing the accounts the charity follows best practice as set out in the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (SORP), issued in March 2005.

Cash flow statement

The company has taken advantage of the exemption available per FRS1 for small companies not to prepare a cash flow statement

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income

Voluntary income is received by way of donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable

Investment income is included when receivable

Incoming resources from grants, where related to performance and specific deliverables, are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by its performance

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the audit fees and costs linked to the strategic management of a charity

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the SoFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned on an appropriate basis.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, in the year of acquisition, in equal instalments at rates calculated to write off fixed assets over their useful lives, as follows
