STRATEGIC REPORT

BUSINESS REVIEW

Turnover in 2014 increased by 4.4% compared with 2013 (2013 – 1.3% increase). Sales in Europe increased by 48.2% and sales in the rest of the world (primarily due to acquisition) by 94.6% whilst UK sales decreased by 4.9%. The UK remains the most significant market for the group, accounting for 77.3% of total turnover (2013 – 84.8%).

The overall UK shower market value grew by 2.5% compared with 2013. The group's main showering business in the UK market increased sales by 3.9%. The directors are satisfied that the overall market, and the company's share of that market, is increasing.

In July 2014 the group acquired an off the shelf company CMN Seventy Five Participações Ltda, subsequently renamed Cerâmica KK Participações Ltda. On 31 October 2014, Cerâmica KK Participações Ltda acquired 100% of the issued share capital of Fênix Participações Societârias S.A. which owns 36% of Fiori Cerâmica Ltda for cash consideration of £10,335,000. Cerâmica KK Participações Ltda acquired the remaining 64% of the issued share capital of Fiori Cerâmica Ltda from private individuals for cash consideration of £18,372,000.

The net loss for the year reduced by £4.2m, this is mainly due to a £5.8m reduction in interest payable and £0.6m reduction in exceptional costs offset by £1.3m loss arising from new acquisitions and £1.0m lower equity minority interests.

The group's net assets have decreased by £8.7m in the year. The composition of net assets has changed due to acquisition activity; a cash payment of £29.1m has been replaced by the subsidiaries' net assets and goodwill; excluding this acquisition, underlying net assets have changed as follows: goodwill has decreased by £14.0m due to amortization; tangible assets have risen by £3.1m due to £10.5m capital expenditure, offset by depreciation; stocks increased by £3.1m due to phasing and outsourcing. Creditors decreased £1.9m due mainly to lower intercompany payables; and the pension liability increased by £2.7m.

The company takes its commitment to health and safety extremely seriously; in the UK, the group has achieved the "Kohler Safety Management System" award and is working toward Tier IV level. There has been a slight decrease during 2014 in the Days Away Restricted Time Rate from 1.0 to 0.6. The rating is a composite measure of number of accidents, days lost and restricted days as a proportion of hours worked. In addition, the group is participating in sustainability initiatives and is actively looking at ways to reduce carbon emissions, water usage and packaging waste.

There have been no significant events since the balance sheet date.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The directors anticipate that the current level of activity will be maintained by the continued strategy of increasing market share and new product development.

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The group's activities expose it to a number of financial risks including cash flow risk and credit risk.

Cash flow risk

The group's activities expose it primarily to the financial risks of changes in foreign currency exchange rates due to a level of purchases made from outside the UK. The group does not actively hedge these exposures, although the group also makes sales outside the UK which produces a natural hedge.

Credit risk

The group's principal financial assets are bank balances and cash, trade and other debtors.

The group's credit risk is primarily attributable to its trade debtors. The group has no significant concentration of credit risk, with exposure spread over a large number of customers.

DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2014.

GOING CONCERN

The group's business activities, together with the factors likely to affect its future development, performance and position, are set out in the Strategic Report.

It has been another challenging year with difficult economic conditions and an unpredictable market which has had an impact on trading; however, in these difficult times the group has continued to gain market share through quality products, innovation and acquisition.

During the year, the group has had sufficient net cash, generated from product sales and ultimate parent company investment, to fund the business and this is expected to continue for the foreseeable future. The current economic conditions create uncertainty, particularly over the level of demand for the group's products. Changes in the exchange rate between sterling and the US Dollar and between sterling and the Euro have consequences for the cost of the group's raw materials and finished goods stock.

The group's forecasts and projections, taking into account the difficult market conditions, show that the group should be able to operate at the current level and achieve growth in both sales and cash inflows over the coming years.

The directors, after careful consideration, have a reasonable expectation that the group has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The group loss for the year was £4,916,000 (2013 – £9,072,000).

The directors cannot propose a dividend (2013 - £nil).

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

The group aims to commit sufficient resources to research and development so as to ensure that it maintains a competitive position in the market. During the year, the group invested £7,786,000 (2013 - £7,295,000) in research and development.

DIRECTORS

The directors of the company, who served throughout the financial year and subsequently, are shown on page 2.

EMPLOYEE CONSULTATION

The group has continued to examine ways and means of providing employment for disabled employees, under normal terms and conditions, with opportunities and established procedures for joint consultation.

No payments were made during the year for political purposes (2013 - £nil).

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards. The particular accounting policies adopted, which have been applied consistently throughout the current and the prior financial year, are described below.

Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

Basis of consolidation

The group financial statements consolidate the financial statements of Kohler Holdings Limited and its subsidiary undertakings drawn up to 31 December 2014.

The results of subsidiaries acquired or sold are consolidated for the periods from or to the date on which control passed. Acquisitions are accounted for under the acquisition method.

No profit and loss account is presented for Kohler Holdings Limited, as permitted by s408 of the Companies Act 2006. The result for the year is shown in note 20.

Through the issue by Kohler Holdings Limited of an irrevocable and unconditional guarantee relating to their liabilities, the following subsidiaries are exempt from the requirement relating to audit of accounts under S479A of the Companies Act 2006:

Going concern

The financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis. The group's business activities, together with the factors likely to affect its future development, performance and position, are set out in the Business Review section of the strategic report. The rationale for applying the going concern basis is discussed in the directors' report.

Intangible assets - goodwill

Goodwill arising on the acquisition of businesses, representing any excess of the fair value of the consideration given over the fair value of the identifiable assets and liabilities acquired, is capitalised and written off on a straight-line basis over its useful economic life, which is estimated to be 20 years. Provision is made for any impairment.

Intangible assets - patents

Patents are amortised over a period of five years.

Intangible assets - other

Other intangible assets are amortised over a period consisting of the expected useful economic life of each intangible asset, as assessed by external advisers. The amortisation period varies from one year to 19 years.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS Year ended 31 December 2014

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost or valuation, net of depreciation and any provision for impairment. Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, other than freehold land, at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation, less estimated residual value, of each asset on a straight-line or reducing balance basis over its expected useful life, as follows:

Freehold buildings Long/short leasehold land and buildings Plant and machinery Fixtures, fittings, tools and equipment 4% declining balance
Higher of 2.5% per annum/term of lease
10 - 50% per annum
10 - 33.3% per annum

Residual value is calculated on prices prevailing at the date of acquisition or revaluation.

Investments

Fixed asset investments are shown at cost less provision for impairment.

Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost includes materials, direct labour and an attributable proportion of manufacturing overheads based on normal levels of activity. Net realisable value is based on estimated selling price, less further costs expected to be incurred to completion and disposal. Provision is made for obsolete, slow-moving or defective items where appropriate.

Warranty provision

Provision is made for the costs estimated to arise over the warranty period of repairs to, or replacement of, goods sold under warranty up to the year-end.

Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods and services arising from one class of business, provided in the normal course of business, net of trade discounts, VAT and other sales-related taxes. Turnover on the sale of goods is recognised at the point of despatch to the customer. Turnover relating to associated services is recognised on provision of the service.

Research and development

Research and development expenditure is charged to the profit and loss account as incurred.

Leases

Rentals under operating leases are charged on a straight-line basis over the lease term, even if the payments are not made on such a basis.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate of exchange at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the balance sheet date are reported at the rates of exchange prevailing at that date.

The results of overseas operations are translated at the average monthly rates of exchange and their balance sheets at the rates ruling at the balance sheet date. Exchange differences arising on translation of the opening net assets and on foreign currency borrowings, to the extent that they hedge the group's investment in such operations, are reported in the statement of total recognised gains and losses. All other exchange differences are included in the profit and loss account.

Taxation

Current UK corporation tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

The charge for taxation is based on the result for the year and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes. Deferred tax is not provided on timing differences arising from the revaluation of fixed assets where there is no commitment to sell the asset. Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is regarded as more likely than not that they will be recovered. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Pension costs

For defined benefit schemes the amounts charged to the profit and loss account are the current service costs and gains and losses on settlements and curtailments. They are included as part of staff costs. Past service costs are recognised immediately in the profit and loss account if the benefits have vested. If the benefits have not vested immediately, the costs are recognised over the period until vesting occurs. The interest costs and the expected return on assets are shown as a net amount of other finance costs or credits adjacent to interest. Actuarial gains and losses are recognised immediately in the statement of total recognised gains and losses.

Defined benefit schemes are funded, with the assets of the company held separately from those of the group, in separate trustee-administered funds. Pension scheme assets are measured at fair value and liabilities are measured on an actuarial basis using the projected unit method and discounted at a rate equivalent to the current rate of return on a high quality corporate bond of equivalent currency and term to the scheme liabilities. The actuarial valuations are obtained at least once every three years and are updated at each balance sheet date. The resulting defined benefit asset or liability, net of related deferred tax, is presented separately after other net assets on the face of the balance sheet.

For the defined contribution scheme the amount charged to the profit and loss account in respect of pension costs and other post-retirement benefits is the contribution payable in the year. Differences between the contributions payable in the year and contributions actually paid are shown as either accruals or prepayments in the balance sheet.
