#### Notes to the Accounts

#### 1. Purchase of Equipment

Groam House Museum has continued the practice of writing off the full costs of equipment in the year of purchase. This corresponds both with public sector funding practice and with the realities of a small charity, where a future income stream, against which costs can be carried forward, is never assured.

#### 2. Members' Funds

As a Company limited by guarantee, Groam House Museum has no share capital, nor are its members required to contribute, except to the extent guaranteed (£1 per member) in the event of an insolvent winding up.

#### 3. Accounts Format

The format of this Extract of Accounts has been amended to align with the format approved by the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator.

#### 4. Grant Funded Activity

The Heritage Lottery funded "Developing the George Bain Collection" project is ongoing, with the acquisition of many exciting artifacts. The "Education & Outreach" phase of the project is about to start with the first exhibition in Iona this summer. This and further external exhibitions will be accompanied by an ambitious programme of lectures, workshops and other related activities. This and several other smaller projects will be funded from a variety of grant agencies who have wholeheartedly supported the museum in its endeavours.

#### 5. Revenue Funding

Revenue income is derived principally from the Highland Council annual grant, donations and museum shop profit. The Highland Council grant has been pegged for several years and this, together with the difficult trading conditions in the current financial climate has greatly reduced our effective income and hence our ability to absorb the steady inflation of our outgoings, particularly those related to energy usage. Our difficulties will be further exacerbated by a planned 15% cut in the Highland Council grant in April 2012. To meet this challenge, the Board of Directors is taking urgent action to seek sponsors and identify various options for sustained revenue fundraising.
