The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

2014 has been a successful year for Luanda Links. We are now in a strong financial position, having run a large fundraising campaign RACE2EDUCATE through crowd funding. We exceeded our initial target, raising £3,411 and are in a position to fund all of Luanda Links' future commitments in 2015 including the funding the charity provides for girls in school in Luanda at the moment. Furthermore the charity is formally registered with HM Revenue and Customs and all the relevant bank accounts are now in place.

At the close of 2014, the decision was made to change the leadership structure to reflect the change in focus of Luanda Links in 2015. Two directors were removed so that two remain with a company secretary also retaining their role. Thanks to the fundraising work in 2014, Luanda Links is able financially to fund the girls through the next two years of education. Our objectives for 2015 are to develop a school programme to run in secondary schools in the UK and create a website for the charity.

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
