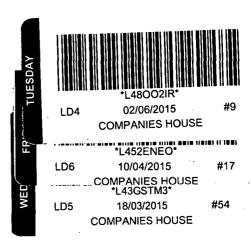

Directors' Report For the year ended 30 June 2014

The directors present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2014.

Directors' responsibilities statement

The directors are responsible for preparing the Directors' report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the year ended 30 June 2014

1. Accounting Policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The principal accounting policies of the company are set out below. All accounting policies, aside from those set out in 1.13, remain unchanged from the previous year. The directors have reviewed the principal accounting policies of the company and consider that they remain the most appropriate.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

1.2 Going concern

The directors have considered the financial position of the company, future secured contracts and forecasts for a period of at least 12 months from the date of approval of the financial statements and are of the opinion that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing these financial statements.

1.3 Basis of consolidation

The financial statements consolidate the accounts of MWR Infosecurity Limited and all of its subsidiary undertakings ('subsidiaries'), as detailed in note 8.

The results of subsidiaries acquired during the year are included from the effective date of acquisition.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption contained within 408 of the Companies Act 2006 not to present its own Profit and loss account.

The (loss)/profit account for the year dealt with in the accounts of the company was (£470,444) (2013 - £203,541).

1.4 Turnover

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the company in respect of services supplied during the year, exclusive of Value Added Tax and trade discounts. Income arising from the provision of consultancy services is recognised as the work is performed. Fees relating to contracts that straddle a period end are recognised over the period in which services are performed, and adjustments are made, where necessary, for deferred revenue at the balance sheet date.

1.5 Intangible fixed assets and amortisation

Amortisation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset, deemed 5 years, on a straight line basis.

1.6 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

Leasehold property

Computer equipment

1.7 Investments

Investments in subsidiaries are included at cost less provision for impairment.

1.8 Operating leases

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the Profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term.

Benefits received and receivable as an incentive to sign an operating lease are recognised on a straight line basis over the period until the date the rent is expected to be adjusted to the prevailing market rate.

1.9 Deferred taxation

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation.

A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated at the tax rates expected to be effective at the time the timing differences are expected to reverse.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

1.10 Foreign currencies

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date.

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate ruling on the date of the transaction.

Exchange gains and losses are recognised in the Profit and loss account.

1.11 Research and development

Research and development expenses are expensed to the Profit and loss account as they are incurred. Please refer to 1.13 of the acconting policies which discusses a change in accounting policy in respect of such expenses and an adjustment that has also been processed through the prior year reserves in respect of this.

1.12 Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme and the pension charge represents the amounts payable by the company to the fund in respect of the year.

1. Accounting Policies (continued)

1.13 Prior year adjustment

Previously capitalised expenses relating to the development of courses run by the company are now expensed as they are incurred. This has resulted in an adjustment to the prior year reserves.

This prior year adjustment has been processed as the directors are of the opinion that the write off of such expenses to the Profit and loss account is a more appropriate treatment.

During the year retirement benefits were accruing to 3 directors (2013 - 2) in respect of defined contribution pension schemes.

One director remunerated through the company is subscribed to the share option scheme. During the year, the price of the share options have changed. This is the result of a 299 for 1 bonus issue. Taking into account this new issue, 18,000 options were granted on 1 November 2010 which could be exercised in the period 1 November 2013 - 1 November 2020. 6,000 options were granted on 22 January 2013 which could be exercised in the period 22 January 2016 - 22 January 2023 provided contracted conditions have been met. A further 12,000 options were granted on 10 August 2013 which could be exercised in the period 10 August 2016 - 10 August 2023 provided contracted conditions have been met.

5. Share options

The company set up a share-option scheme on 1 November 2010. The scheme is open to nominated members of staff. To be eligible for this scheme the nominated members of staff must work at least 25 hours a week for the company or work 75% of their time for the company. The options can be exercised after a period of 3 years and must be exercised within 10 years. If the option holder ceases employment the options will lapse and be forfeited. Furthermore, the option may be exercised in the event of a sale of the Company, only to the extent that the options has vested at that point in time.

During the year the company granted 70,500 share options on 30 August 2013 at a price of £0.09 a share. In previous years the shares were offered at a price of £3.30 a share. However during the year, the price of the options have changed, the result of a 299 for 1 bonus issue.
