The Directors present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 May 2010

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee and is governed by its Memo and Articles of Association.

The company was incorporated and registered as a charity on 11 May 1998.

Recruitment and Appointment of Directors

At present there are two directors of the company to manage and promote the charity's activities. No directors are employees of the company.

Objectives and Activities

The company's objects and principal activities are the protection of life by the provision and maintenance of an inshore rescue facility available for use in any emergency life saving situation connected with use by the general public of the inland and coastal waters of the United Kingdom. The company promotes its activities through publicity in cooperation with the press and other sources as well as the distribution of information pamphlets and other literature.

Achievements and Performance

The Port William Inshore Rescue Service is actively involved in local community events and maintains a high public profile.

The members give willingly of their time and skills and provide a high standard of service, which is recognised by the public.

During the year the crew responded to five call outs, all dealt with successfully.

Essential training for the crew continues as well as maintenance of equipment to comply with MCA standards. A grant of £1002 was awarded by Dumfries & Galloway Council to assist with the upgrading and replacement of safety equipment.

Financial Review

The charity has generated a net decrease in funds in the year of £2169.

The strategy is to continue to build reserves through fundraising activities.

The directors policy is to build up financial reserves for the eventual replacement of the rescue boat.

Responsibilities of the Directors

The directors, who served during the year and up to the date of this report are set out on page 1. We certify that as directors of the company we have taken all the steps that we ought to have taken in order to make ourselves aware of any relevant information of which the Independent Examiner should be aware.

1 Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

(b) Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the directors in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

(c) Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full
 in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not
 conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when
 the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.
- · Investment income is interest receivable on the company bank accounts.
- Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included in these accounts.
- Incoming resources from charitable trading activity are accounted for when earned.
- Incoming resources from grants, where related to performance and specific deliverables, are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by its performance.

(d) Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred.

- Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income and the costs of trading for fundraising purposes.
- Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of
 its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be
 allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to
 support them.
- Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.
- Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

(e) Fixed assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation, which is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset on a reducing balance basis over its expected useful life.

Independent Examiner's Report To the Trustees of Port William Inshore Rescue Service

I report on the accounts of Port William Inshore Rescue Service for the year ended 31 May 2010, which are set out on pages 3 to 7.

Respective Responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner.
