In furtherance of our objectives, we follow the code of conduct of British Confederation of Psychotherapists and that of the United Kingdom Council of Psychotherapy

To provide counselling for those with personal, psychological and emotional difficulties in the Borough

The company is limited by guarantee and does not have a share capital. The liability of the members in the event of the company being liquidated is limited to ten pounds per member.

Ensuring our work delivers our aims:

We review our aims, objectives and activities each year, this review looks at what we achieved and the outcomes of our work in the previous 12 months. The review looks at the success and the benefits they have brought to those who we intended to help. We have referred to the guidance from the Charity Commission on public benefit in reviewing and planning our objectives.

How our activities deliver public benefit, who used our services and benefited:

Our main activities are as described above, all our charitable activities focus on treating mentally affected people. Our objects and funding limit the service we provide to those resident in the Borough

The funds/reserves have decreased from £119,702 (2010) to £116,578 (2011)

Currently our principal funding source is in the form of a Grant by The Camden Primary Care Trust
