STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 29 August 2000. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up the members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1 each.

Appointment of directors

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purposes of charity law and under the company's Articles are known as members of the Board of Directors. In accordance with the Articles of Association any Member Director appointed by the directors since the last General Meeting along with one third of the remaining Member Directors retire by rotation each year and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.

The Appointed Directors vacate office at the conclusion of the AGM but may be reappointed by the Directors after the AGM.

Risk management

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and financing of the charity and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate these.

TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT (continued)

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objectives and principal activities of the Charitable Company are:

- 1) To expand and improve the programme of live performance in Dumfries Theatre Royal and build viable audiences for the increased range of products.
- 2) To achieve mutually beneficial partnerships with educational bodies at all levels within Dumfries and Galloway through which to create a programme of enjoyable, educational activities.
- 3) To ensure that the Theatre Royal is known as a facility that is open and accessible to all people and that the product mix reflects this aim.
- 4) To provide a facility for the development of art activities and projects by other arts organisations that will complement work within the area.
- 5) To make the Theatre Royal a valuable asset for the development of the economy of Dumfries and Galloway

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Following the adoption and publication of the Dumfries and Galloway Council's Cultural Strategy, which includes the aim of achieving a Cultural Centre for Dumfries, the Trust has been involved in the completion of the Council's condition survey of the Theatre Royal, along with the Guild of Players.

The process has been lengthy, and in the middle the Trust and Guild of Players found themselves with a change of personnel, and consequently changes in advice and support. The original timescale had aimed to have the condition survey, and costs, completed by December 2009, so that the Report could go to Committee in the early part of 2010. As a result of the press coverage of the Guild of Players Golden Jubilee, the report is scheduled to go to Area Committee in early October; the works included will permit the Guild to work and present productions over the winter period of 2010-11. A further report, for the Policy Committee, will seek support from the reserved £455,000 to make the theatre more flexible to use, and to assist compliance with access requirements. A precedent for support was established with the award of funds toward improvements in the lighting system in 2007.

The intention is to provide a ten-year life for the Theatre Royal through works to improve heating, accessibility, safety and security, with a potential future project to make improvements to the working of the building by changed location for the box office, and improved resources for rehearsal. The Guild of Players have identified improvements by re-siting storage and increasing flexibility for rehearsal and production preparation. This could permit a more varied programme and guarantee that the chills of the 2009-10 winter do not deter either participants or audiences in the future. Dumfries & Galloway Council are keen to see additional benefits for residents resulting from their investment, and expect that the Trust, in continued partnership with the Guild of Players, will seek external funds toward both renovations and an enhanced programme of activity.

TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT (continued)

Pending preparation of the Report to Policy Committee and recommended course of action to Dumfries & Galloway Council, the Trust and the Guild, have been marking time for much of the year. This has placed the project into the context of the extremely difficult financial situation faced by all public funders, and makes the award of the 2006 earmarked funds a harder goal to achieve. The Trust and Guild of Players have co-operated with Dumfries & Galloway Council officers and the recent interest of the Chief Executive has been welcomed.

The Trust received the final payment of the outstanding funds from the Scottish Arts Council during the year and is glad to record that at the end of the year the Trust is solvent with funds in hand. The Trust can record that the membership remains interested in the project, and that throughout the year a faithful group has met regularly to try and progress the plans for interim repairs and refurbishments. The Trust and its partner, the Guild of Players, owe much to those who volunteer and whose interest in seeing live theatre in Dumfries continue for the future. Peter Robertson is to retire as a Director and Honorary Secretary. His contribution has been valuable, as has his support, and thanks are due to him for his input.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

During the year the Charity received grants and other income totalling £651 and spent £208 resulting in a surplus of £443 in the year. There was a balance brought forward from the previous year of £30,263 resulting in a balance to carry forward of £30,706.

Reserves Policy

The directors have identified the need to maintain a reserve sufficient to cover the cost of approximately six months expenditure estimated at £2,000. Unrestricted reserve at the financial year end exceeded this amount.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

The structural survey done in 2009 confirmed that the Theatre Royal has a life expectancy that will permit both the Guild of Players productions, and visiting productions, to continue for up to ten years, given adequate maintenance. However, the plans for a new cultural centre, with theatre, either on one site, or more than one, must be kept alive despite the difficult economic conditions, so that the long process of securing funding can start, and the centre be ready by the time the existing facilities are too well-worn to continue.

The Trust will continue to keep all interested in the project abreast of progress, via the website and periodic newsletters. Culturally-led regeneration may be the current phraseology - in 1792 it was the audience and the appetite for entertainment that opened a theatre in the regional capital, to which folk from all walks of life could come. The Dumfries Theatre Development Trust will be working energetically with partners to replicate that enterprise, so that audiences and participants can continue to share the rewards of live performance equally with those who live in Scotland's urban centres.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER

A resolution to re-appoint Carson & Trotter as independent examiner for the ensuing year will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2010

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005), the Companies Act 2006 and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included in these accounts.

Investment income is included when receivable.

Incoming resources from grants, where related to performance and specific deliverables, are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by its performance.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the directors in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the directors for particular purposes.

Restricted funds are subject to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

The Charity Trustees are satisfied that all Funds received, other than those identified as Restricted Funds, relate directly to the core purposes of the Charity and are not subject to restrictions beyond the general objectives of the Charity and accordingly, they are accounted for as "Unrestricted Funds".

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2010

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates:

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the accounts certification fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the Statement of Financial Activities on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource.

Grants payable are payments made to third parties in the furtherance of the charitable objectives of the Charity. The grants are accounted for where either the trustees have agreed to pay the grant without condition and the recipient has a reasonable expectation that they will receive a grant, or any condition attaching to the grant is outside the control of the Charity.

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.
