Reserves Policy

Reserves are set at a level to cover possible staff redundancies and to continue to provide support to the local community in the event of a loss of funding

Risk Assessment

Although the Centre's work is not at immediate risk from a shortage of money, the search for new sources of funding continues, quite properly, to occupy much of the Charity's time and energy. In addition to the grants from Oxfordshire County Council we have received contributions from South Oxfordshire and the Vale of White Horse District Councils. We hope this funding will be repeated in future years.

In the next two years the contracts for the services provided by the Centre will be put out to tender and we intend to continue to provide good quality, value for money services for the local community

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objects for which the Charity is established are to alleviate the conditions of life among people who are caring or have cared for the elderly, sick, disabled, handicapped or otherwise infirm persons at home. The Charity's work covers the Districts of South Oxfordshire and the Vale of the White Horse. There are believed to be more than 20,000 Carers in this area and the centre has provided varying information and advice to a considerable number of them, people who are voluntarily caring for someone who is elderly or sick or has physical or learning disabilities (including children with special needs)

The objectives of the Charity are set out below

- * To increase access to information, advice and advocacy for Carers
- * To increase access to support services for Carers in both urban and rural communities
- * To establish information on a range of services, to provide advice to enable Carers to make an independent assessment of their own needs, and to act as a broker when necessary
- * To maximize the availability of existing services and facilities through co-operation with service providers
- * To work towards increasing the range of services available
- * To provide and increase opportunities for Carers to receive emotional support
- * To ensure through appropriate channels that local Carers' needs and priorities are represented in Community Care planning process
- * To provide training and education for local agencies, volunteers, professionals and the general public on Carers' needs and priorities

REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS, ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

The South and Vale Cares Centre had a successful year providing advice, information and support to Carers throughout the South and Vale districts of Oxfordshire

During the year we have continued to support 414 carers already known to us and 755 carers have contacted us for the first time, 1169 in total. There were 6076 contacts or visits made with carers during the year. 100% of respondents to our satisfaction survey would recommend the service to others. 74% reported that their health and stress levels were improved as a result of our help and 55% were better off financially. We helped carers and their families improve their financial situation by at least £770,000 over the year.

The Centre has helped around 50 carers and their families successfully challenge decisions about benefits at tribunals and we have continued to provide general advice about legal matters such as wills, probate and lasting power of attorney

In consultation with carers we have organised 8 trips over the year so that they can have a break as well as meet other carers. This included a theatre visit to see the Phantom of the Opera in London and a day out for families to Bournemouth. We have also organised 6 training sessions for carers on topics such as First Aid and Depression and Low Moods and promoted other training opportunities.

With the Time for Carers fund from Oxfordshire County Council we have been able to fund 1028 breaks for carers and provide 93 pieces of equipment to make their caring role easier. This funding provides a prompt and flexible service in order to meet carers' needs. Support for carers is a clear priority for the County Council and they were able to almost double this particular fund this year.

We have developed a befriending service where volunteers are able to sit with people who cannot be left on their own in order to give the carer a break. We have also established closer links with GP practices in the districts so that carers can be quickly identified and given prompt information and advice.

We have continued to raise the profile of Young Carers with our development work with schools and other organisations, helping to ensure that Young Carers are recognised and provided with the support they need to fulfil their potential. We have worked closely with other agencies to ensure the young people have appropriate support in challenging circumstances. We have organized 24 outings for Young Carers, including residential trips to events such as the Young Carers' Festival which enable them to have a break

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

In line with the new Carers Strategy we will maintain our outreach service so that carers have access to both comprehensive information and advice so they can make informed decisions. Consultation with the Young Carers has identified a need for more individual support. We also have a group of older Young Carers who are keen to support others in similar situations and we are piloting a mentoring project to meet this need. The continuation of the Time for Carers funding from the County Council will allow us to provide short breaks and equipment when Carers most need it. We have employed a development co-ordinator to work with health care professionals to ensure carers are promptly identified and properly supported, an approach which is promoted in the New Deal for Carers Strategy, recently published by the government. The issue of employment for carers has been a concern for a long time and has now been highlighted in the strategy and we will continue to work closely with other stakeholders to identify the best way of supporting carers who are working or wish to return to employment. We intend to build on the success of the sitting service through recruiting more volunteers to give carers a break.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The year has been eventful and not altogether easy. We have lost our staunch supporter and Trustee, Margaret MacKenzie who died and is very much missed by us all. The funeral service with over 300 people present was a much deserved tribute to a very great lady.

Eleanor Cowan has now completed her first full year as manager and has coped extremely well with the ever changing conditions which beset us. Finella Dean left us, on her husband's transfer, after 10 years of devoted service. A wonderful team player and a great professional she was loved and respected by all. We are very fortunate to have Jackie Chown to replace her as she had already worked for us for three years before her husband was transferred. Two new members of staff have joined us to undertake new projects, Chris Elliott and Sue Jeffs are both very experienced and have fitted in well.

Financially we are fortunate that Oxfordshire County council was able to maintain the level of our grant and has added new elements. On the other hand they are beset by bureaucracy, some from our government and some from the EU which makes life ever more burdensome without much helping our clients. The chief challenge will be to tender for the services we provide in competition with other possible providers. This risks destroying a valuable team with 12 years continuity. It also involves a great administrative cost which would be better devoted to clients. I feel I have been inveigling against ever increasing bureaucracy ever since. I became Chairman and I make no apology for continuing to emphasise the point - it is encouraging to see the Head of our local Thames Valley Police Force saying she will no longer sacrifice good policing to targets and box ticking.

The three Oxfordshire Centres and the Forum are working in ever closer cooperation in coping with common problems and the Forum has had a very positive and supportive response from our local MPs

Our work continues to expand and it has been very gratifying to receive the most positive feedback from our clients. Not only do they feel we have reduced their stress levels but in a significant number of cases we have been able to ease their financial situation.

I conclude, as I have done so continuously in the past, with the most profound admiration of our staff and my grateful thanks for their skill and loyal dedication to a very difficult task. Equally our Trustees and Management Committee, all volunteers, have brought great professional skills of varying sorts to their contributions. I personally could not fulfil my duties without their wonderful support. It is a marvellous team and I enjoy every moment of my work with them.

FINANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

During the year our income rose from £299,371 to £354,460, an increase of over 18% This allowed us to increase our expenditure from £277,389 to £280,554. We would like to thank Oxfordshire Social and Community Services, South Oxfordshire District Council, Vale of White Horse District Council, Oxfordshire Youth (Opportunities/Capital) Fund, the many Town and Parish Councils, other community organisations and individuals for their continuing financial support of our work.

The trustees have identified two challenges which they plan to address over the coming year. Firstly, we would like to identify more sources of income in order to reduce our reliance on funding from one large source, Oxfordshire County Council Secondly, approximately 50% of our income in this year was restricted to specific projects. We would like to increase the amount of funding which we receive which is not restricted in this way in order to increase our flexibility to respond to local needs.

In order to maintain the orderly running of the centre in the event of an unexpected delay or loss of funding, the trustees have determined that they need to maintain a General Fund reserve of between £50,000 and £100,000 The current level of this reserve is at the upper end of this range

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1a Accounting Conventions

The accounts have been prepared under the historic cost convention and in accordance with the Statements of Recommended Practice (SORP), "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" published in 2005 and applicable accounting standards

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement

1b Company Status

The company is limited by guarantee and is a registered charity. The members of the company are the trustees named on page 2.

1c Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds

- i) General these funds are expendable at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objectives of the charity and for the overall administration of the charity
- ii) Designated these are funds which have been set aside out of unrestricted funds by the trustees for purposes or projects to which the charity are not committed but intend to promote and follow

Restricted funds

These are funds upon which restrictions and specific criteria for their use are imposed by the donor

1d Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitles to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitles to the grant

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included in these accounts.

Investment income is included when receivable

Incoming resources from grants, where related to performance and specific deliverables are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by its performance



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1e Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the audit fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity

1f Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows

Office Equipment 15% per annum Computer Equipment 33 1/3% per annum

1g Pension costs

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme for employees
The assets of the scheme are held separately form those of the charity
The annual contributions payable are charged to the statement of financial activities
The pension cost charge represents contributions payable by the charity to the fund

1h Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged to the statement of financial activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease

A) Time for Carers (Restricted)

The charity receives a further grant from Oxfordshire County Council to operate a relief scheme for carers in the region to allow them to take a break from their caring role. Whilst the grant can be interpreted as an unrestricted grant as it is in accordance with the overall objectives of the charity, the trustees have decided that for management and accountability purposes, this fund should be classed as a restricted fund.

B) Breakfund (Restricted)

The Young Carers Breakfund is funded by Oxfordshire Carers Strategy Money is given to the Centre to be distributed to any young carer for individual breaks away from their caring role No maximum amount is specified but grants are usually restricted to £100 per year per individual

C) Computer Fund (Restricted)

This one off grant was awarded by Oxfordshire County Council to enable the Centre to develop and maintain an IT system to fulfil the Council's monitoring requirements

D) Casual Sessional Worker (Restricted)

The casual sessional worker accompanies the Young Carers on our trips and offers advice and support. The funding is from Oxfordshire County Council Youth Opportunities Grant, The Chill out Fund and donation from the Lions of Thame and Henley Rotary Club.

E) Direct Breaks (Restricted)

This is an additional grant from Oxfordshire County Council to provide grants of up to £250 to fund breaks and services for carers

F) GP Outreach (Restricted)

Again this is an additional grant from Oxfordshire County Council to work with the health service to ensure "hidden" carers are quickly identified and are able to access advice and support

G) Befriending Sitting Service (Restricted)

This grant from Oxfordshire County Council enables the Centre to recruit, train and support volunteers who are then able to sit with someone who is unable to be left on their own in order to give the carer a break

H) Young Carers Project (Designated)

This fund was established by the trustees and consists of donations made by individuals or institutions with more emphasis towards Young Carers projects. Whilst the donations were general donations for the benefit of the charity as a whole, the trustees have recognised the intention for these funds and have separately identified these funds for future use towards Young Carers projects. Now that the Young Carers Project restricted fund has finished, these funds will be utilised to continue the work that the Centre has established in the community over the next few months.
